Towards a Nuclear Free future

Hundreds of Nuclear Free Zones already exist. In Europe, Australia, New Zealand and Japan, many communities have become nuclear free. Over 100 local governments in England and Scotland, and all of Wales, have declared themselves Nuclear Free Zones. Popular campaigns are underway in Canada, Eastern Europe, and the Pacific Islands. Belau, an island in Micronesia, has become the first country to adopt a nuclear free constitution. International treaties have established Nuclear Free Zones in South America, Antarctica, outer space, and the seabed. Treaties under consideration would create Nuclear Free Zones in Scandinavia, the Balkans, the Mediterranean, the Middle East, Africa and South East Asia.

Now the movement has crossed the Atlantic. Nuclear Free Zones campaigns are springing up all across our country.

This method of promoting world-wide peace is recommended by the General Assembly of the United Nations (Dec. 75 and June '78). The United Nations proclaimed that "the process of establishing such zones in different parts of the world should be encouraged with the ultimate objective of achieving a world entirely free of nuclear weapons."
