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\$20.00: Surviving College Successfully

Are your children prepared to face the rigors of college life? You'll spend nearly \$20,000.00 for your child's education. Why not spend \$20.00 to make sure he or she gets it? Gary DeMar put three years of work into this book. He has chosen the best techniques for studying from over 100 books on the subject. The chapters on the Christian world view are unique. \$25.00: Money, Power, Greed

The integrity of many Christian ministries has been severely compromised to say the least. Questionable fund raising practices abound. This book makes a strong biblical case for Christian responsibility, not only for the ministries but for those who are supporting them with their money. You will learn how to identify the crooks and the cons. Also included: a *Donor's Bill of Rights* to help Christians make responsible decisions about supporting a ministry. Every Christian ought to read it.

\$30.00: Power in the Blood

David Chilton's book is one of the most important books published this year. It's more than a book about AIDS. Not only will you get a lesson on what homosexuals do (something the media fail to mention), but you will also learn how the church has failed in its response to the "plague." Chilton's description of a phone conversation he had with a San Francisco radio call-in program is worth the price of the book.

\$50.00: The Dominion Covenant: Genesis

Gary North has been working on his economic commentary on the Bible for nearly 20 years. He spends two hours *every day*, no matter where he is, on the project. So far he has gotten through the book of Exodus. Exodus alone has taken three volumes. But *The Dominion Covenant* is the first volume in the series. There is more here than economics. A whole host of topics are covered, from mathematics to creation. There is a fascinating discussion of time and how it affects economic development.

\$50.00: Reforming Fundamentalism

In 1980 George Marsden wrote a fascinating history of fundamentalism: *Fundamentalism and American Culture*. It was a ground breaking book. Marsden has written a worthy sequel in *Reforming Fundamentalism*. Using the beginnings of Fuller Seminary as his historical "window," Marsden gives us a glimpse of evangelicalism after World War II.
