

dependent satellite regimes, and the threat of nuclear annihilation.

To reduce the likelihood of war, the dominant economic institutions of world society should be democratically controlled. This implies a high degree of worker control, a vigorous cooperative movement, and the creation of a democratic world polity;

- Reduction of inflation toward zero;
- Extensive federal tax reductions, and a negative income tax;
- Abolition of registration for the military draft; support for conscientious draft resisters;
- Support for the World Peace Tax Fund, and conscientious war tax resisters;
- Support for those who conscientiously decline to work in war industries, or do military research;
- Support for those who engage in nonviolent civil disobedience against military activities;
- Support for the ERA;
- Opposition to all forms of racial, sexual, and religious discrimination, and all unjust socio-economic barriers;
- Abolition of the death penalty;
- National registration of handguns;
- Removal of all social factors that encourage violence;
- Encouragement of intercommunication and the free flow of information between all peoples;
- Respect for cultural diversity;
- Support for one-person-one-vote democratic world government.
