

1992 - The results five Safe Home workshops of 1990 and 1991 will be compiled into a booklet with appropriate reference materials for use by people of modest income. We will continue to offer these workshops provided funding can be obtained.

A second edition of the "Mobile Homes" videotape will be produced using better quality tape which will allow for repeated duplication.

5. Forest Project

1991 - Work in organizing a Kentucky Heartwood Chapter was initiated in the Spring by Bill Spencer and meetings were held in April and again in November. Nine Eco-tours showing the damage to a portion of the Sheltoewe Trace have been conducted and more are being planned. Almost the entire Trace was photographed during a search for undamaged areas for hiking possibilities. The five-state Heartwood Coalition has as one of its policy goals, stopping off-road vehicles in federal forest lands.

1992 - Timothy Collins, a sociologist who specializes in policy analysis, will research the economic and social factors involved in the deterioration of the Kentucky and Appalachian forests because of clear-cutting and heavy logging operations.

6. Calendar Project and Publications

1991 - The 1991 "Appalachia, Land & People" Calendar by Mark Spencer and Warren Brunner proved a best seller and we hope that their 1992 "Heritage" one will equal or surpass it. Martha Bond's personal notes to past buyers have proved valuable. We are working with George Perraut to improve our business expertise in the marketing of the calendar.

The books **ECO-CHURCH** by Al Fritsch and Angela I. Cox (Resource Publications, San Jose, CA) and **DOWN TO EARTH SPIRITUALITY** by Al Fritsch with photos by Warren Brunner (Sheed & Ward, Kansas City, MO) are due out in December and/or January.

"God's Good Earth Study Guide" was completed and is being distributed for evaluation.

1992 - Promotion of new books, calendars, and publications will be given top priority. Two more new books are expected next year as well as a completed study guide.

7. Building Construction

1991 - The building of the library occupied the grounds crew for much of the year. The second floor was finished and occupied in May. The compost toilet (designed at a materials cost of \$458) is now operating. In addition, a masonry oven was designed, installed and now functions well. A first floor enclosure is being built before winter by Lewis VanWinkle and Jeff Cope.

1992 - The library will be completed with running water, solar photovoltaic panels, batteries and a voltage regulator. Other solar components will be added if funds permit. A platform will be built on the back for outside meetings and further walkways will be added as needed. If possible we will expand living space by raising the cordwood building roof and adding a second floor.

8. Other

Robyn Arnold taught the Environmental Science class at Mountain Women's Exchange and gave a number of talks. Al Fritsch delivered 180 talks in 18 states.
