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WORLD WAR 3 ?

Bowing to pressures from the powerful Zionist Lobby, Congress has approved the sending of 200 U.S. technicians to the Sinai as part of the so-called Mideast peace package worked out by America's Zionist Secretary of State, Dr. Henry Kissinger.

The Israelis had refused to sign the peace protocol unless Congress agreed to dispatch of the technicians to the Middle East buffer zone. Ostensibly the purpose of the 200 Americans will be to man early-warning listening posts in the Gidi and Mitla mountain passes between the opposing Israeli and Egyptian forces.

The Sinai pact commits the U.S. to an unprecedented degree in the Mideast, and gives the Israelis an open tap on the United States for all its military and economic needs. The agreement is tantamount to a backdoor security treaty with the Zionist state, and reduces the U.S. to the status of a de facto satellite of Israel.

The Kissinger deal will come high for the American taxpayer. Over the next five years, he will be expected to provide \$15 to \$25 billion to the Zionist state, which amounts to something between \$1,200 and \$2,000 for every man, woman and child in Israel. This financial extravaganza will run three to five times above current levels of largesse for the kosher state, and will take the form of outright grants in aid, rather than loans as in the past.

The United States has also pledged to meet all of Israel's military needs for years to come with the latest and most sophisticated arms. U.S. stockpiles, badly depleted by Jewry after the 1973 war, will be further cannibalized by the Israelis - despite the fact that this will jeopardize America's own national defenses. In addition, the Zionist state has been assured replacement of all the weapons and equipment it might lose in any future war.

The United States, through its Zionist Secretary of State, has also agreed to underwrite all of Israel's petroleum requirements for the next five years. In the event of another war and a new embargo, Israel will receive all the oil it needs from U.S. supplies and will have priority over the American motorist and home user.

The United States has further pledged to take whatever steps may be necessary to deliver the oil in the face of any boycott, embargo or military blockade.

All of these provisions are contained in the secret deal made by Herr. Kissinger with the Israelis. Contrary to public denials by the Zionist Secretary of State, the confidential promises contained in the accord are recognized as having the full force of international understanding, and are binding.

In addition to other considerations, the United States has agreed to pay Iran nearly a half billion dollars annually to provide Israel with petroleum that she was formerly getting from the Abu Rudeis oil fields in the Sinai, which were seized from the Egyptians in 1967. (Over please)
