England began a systematic undermining of the United States of America 37 years ago or to be exact in 1914. It would be more correct to state that British influence became sufficiently strong in that year to change the whole traditional course of our nation thereby dragging us into a European mess from which we have never been able to extricate ourselves.

Winston Churchill who now leaves our shores with a first mortgage upon the life of every man, woman and child in this nation has played a mighty prominent part in our National degradation. He was one of the unholy crew who succeeded in hoodwinking our leaders into the belief that our participation in World War I was necessary for the preservation of world peace. We have alienated the friendship of millions of people across the world who had hitherto looked longingly at this Republic as the haven for the oppressed. Today thanks to Churchill's cunning and duplicity, and the imbecility of some American leaders we are hated and despised as Imperialists. And England has made us just that.

We have thrown billions of the taxpayers money across the world, and England has used a large part of it to manufacture munitions of war for the Communists. There is sorrow, and mourning in thousands of American homes because boys have been killed in Korea by the Chinese Reds with British made weapons. In Detroit nearly 200,000 idle workers roam the streets because Washington has cut off the necessary steel from the motor plants. New York has almost as many idle for the same reason.
