"So often when we talk about the Middle East, we think of war, of conflict . . . of hate. But we rarely think of the people, the victims of this war," comments Dr. James J. Zogby, director of Save Lebanon. "Each child of Lebanon is marked with the scars of this war, and each day brings new wounds. Save Lebanon helps heal these wounds. By reaching out to the children, we can give them hope--hope to go on living."

Much of the aid Save Lebanon has provided during the past two years has been donated by hundreds of generous individuals and institutions. Physicians have donated services, hospitals have waived costs, and individuals have taken children into their homes.

Through this project, children have received new limbs, plastic surgery, major corrective and reconstructive surgery, and rehabilitative therapy. They have been treated in Shriners' hospitals, Childrens' hospitals, and many private institutions in cities across the nation, including Boston, Detroit, Richmond, Atlanta, Chicago, Columbus, Houston, and Washington, DC.
