begin to address the socio-economic sources of contemporary problems. This is why the struggle for peace and against anti-communist hysteria is so important. There is no such thing as an anti-communist approach to the Peace Movement. These are two orientations with very different presuppositions and goals. Yes, it is important for the Peace Movement to criticize the Soviet Union when that nation pursues policies that threaten the peace. Yes, it is important for the Peace Movement to maintain organizational autonomy from both sides of the Cold War. But neither of these recommend a policy of anti-communism. Let us leave the business of factionalizing and attacking the Peace Movement to those who really have the stomach for it—the Right. After all, they've had more practice.

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
